

## 1. Are we available for encounters with God?

## 2. Why would God choose us?

## 3. Why would anyone listen to us?

In what way was Moses' question of God's name valid (why did he need to know God's name)? Discuss the many names Jesus referred to Himself as that included 'I Am the .....'

## 4. What if we don't know what to say?

Why do we make excuses to God (and ourselves) when we don't know how to share Him with others? When we don't know what to say? If you had assurance that God "will help you speak and will teach you what to say" who would talk to about Jesus?
