Have you ever been really BROKEN?

What is the difference between rest and restoration?

Rest is defined as ceasing of activity to relax and refresh, or to recover strength.

Restoring means to give back, to return, to put or bring back into existence and use... to renew. The opposite of restoration is to weaken, undermine, cripple, undo, depress, split or dull.

Jesus wants us to be RESTORED.

Restore to me the joy of Your salvation and sustain me with a willing spirit. - Psalm 51:12

Am I leading on empty?

Dream Zone is where leaders are filled with vision, passion, and enthusiasm for the work entrusted to them. It is a place of inspiration and divine calling.

Drained Zone is a place of weariness, exhaustion, and discouragement. As leaders, we may find ourselves pouring into others, constantly giving without receiving.

Danger Zone is a place of burnout, cynicism, and compromised leadership. Our ability to make wise decisions and positively impact those we lead diminishes significantly.

3 questions that help us understand the restoration process:

1. How do we evaluate our current reality compared to God's intended plan?

Humble yourselves, therefore, under God's mighty hand, that He may lift you up in due time. Cast all your anxiety on Him because He cares for you. - 1 Peter 5:6-7

2. Why do we need to be restored?

3. Who has the power to restore us?
