Have you ever felt the weight of unforgiveness?

Then Peter came to Jesus and asked, "Lord, how many times shall I forgive my brother or sister who sins against me? Up to seven times?" Jesus answered, "I tell you, not seven times, but seventy-seven times. - Matthew 18:21-35

Jesus wants to free us through forgiveness.

For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive others their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins. - Matthew 6:14-15

Am I leading on empty?

Dream Zone is where leaders are filled with vision, passion, and enthusiasm for the work entrusted to them. It is a place of inspiration and divine calling.

Drained Zone is a place of weariness, exhaustion, and discouragement. As leaders, we may find ourselves pouring into others, constantly giving without receiving.

Danger Zone is a place of burnout, cynicism, and compromised leadership. Our ability to make wise decisions and positively impact those we lead diminishes significantly.

3 questions that help us understand the power of forgiveness.

1. Is my unforgiveness growing out of control?

Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you. - Ephesians 4:31-32

2. What are my choices when others drain me?

Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. - Colossians 3:13

3. What happens when we choose forgiveness?

If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. - 1 John 1:9

Jesus knows forgiveness requires prayer.

And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. - Matthew 6:12
